In an episode of 'Taggart' a few years ago, it was highly amusing for my two sons when they discovered that the "dead" body in the river was their school drama teacher. Also amusing was watching the "body" with his throat cut, drinking cups of tea or coffee during a break in takes, and when the "dead" body you have lifted into the boat smiles, winks and laughs when he hears the words "CUT".



How many "takes" can be shot before the film is accepted? I think my record was 48, when a packet of heroin was meant to drift up to the surface, and wasn't behaving itself.

In one Taggart film a Glasgow University eight was told to hit a body floating in the Clyde with their boat and then I had to go out and retrieve the body.

Mark McManus used to come into the house between breaks and sit and chat to my Mother who was bed ridden at that time. He was so nice and kind with Mother. I also remember him getting his photo taken in the boat with one of our local "cops", who was called Taggart.
